

A trip to the café, after a wander around the 30 acres of free-to-use Onny Meadows, with wild play areas and riverside paths, can round off a day out just perfectly.



Brockhampton

At the heart of this 687-hectare (1,700-acre) farmed estate lies Lower Brockhampton Manor House, a romantic timber-framed house dating back to the late 14th century. The house is surrounded by a moat and is entered via a charming timber-framed gatehouse, built 1530-40.

There are miles of walks through the orchards, park and woodlands, featuring ancient trees, the picturesque Lawn Pool and great views of the surrounding Herefordshire countryside. Grab a take-away cup of tea from the Granary Kiosk to take with you as you discover the rich variety of wildlife, along with historic farming breeds such as Hereford cattle and Hebridean sheep.

Ancient orchards engulf the manor house and, at sixty-five acres, are the largest cared for by the National Trust. From spring, children can enjoy the new play trail situated within the orchards and discover the creepy crawlies and birds that make Brockhampton their home.

Berrington Hall

Standing proud and strong, this fine Georgian mansion sits within 'Capability' Brown's final garden and landscape. In the house, discover jewel-like interiors, designed by Henry Holland and home to the Harley, Rodney and Cawley families. Uncover the story of Ann Harley, first lady of Berrington, and see her restored 18th century court mantua dress. Created as the perfect house in the perfect setting, Berrington Hall has many secrets for visitors to uncover.

Walks around the parkland provide spectacular views and you can take a stroll around Berrington's pool which is home to the largest heronry in the West Midlands. After your walk, visit the tea-room to relax with a slice of homemade cake.

The children's play area is fantastic for little explorers to climb, run and jump. The den building area in the parkland provides the perfect location for little ones to put their engineering skills to the test.

Croft Castle

Situated on the English-Welsh border, Croft is a quiet, ancient place steeped in British history and politics with a picturesque castle and medieval parkland re-fashioned during the 18th century.

Surrounded by 1,500 acres of woods, park and farmland, Croft became home to a resilient and prominent family, beginning with Bernard de Croft in the 11th century.

The recently restored Fishpool Valley, which was re-modelled in the late eighteenth century in the 'Picturesque' style, can now be experienced nearly as it would have been two hundred years ago, by following way-marked walks through the valley. After your walk, why not pay a visit to our tea-room for your favourite refreshments?

Children can enjoy pretending they are knights on the castle playground or have an adventure in the natural play area.

Escape to this spectacular riverside garden and be absorbed by natural beauty.

Bordered by the River Wye, The Weir Garden sits within unspoilt Herefordshire countryside and has many historical secrets to uncover. For centuries this site has been used as a pleasure ground for fishing, boating and swimming. It is managed in a natural way to create a varied habitat for wildlife.

In spring see carpets of bulbs beneath ancient trees, in summer enjoy a picnic by the river to watch the wildlife and in autumn visit the walled garden bursting with seasonal produce.

Children can enjoy joining in family walks through the ten-acre garden and playing in the natural play area.

Begin your day at the Heights by taking flight in one of the famous cable cars. Travel across the picturesque Derwent Valley in style and enjoy the views of Matlock Bath below.

It's not just the views from the cable car, there's a new view around every corner once you reach the summit. Experience the Peak District surrounding this special hilltop estate, with views of peaks and valleys everywhere you look.


Take a tour underground in the two famous show caverns. Follow one of the professional cavern guides deep into the hillside and learn tales of mining, history, geology, and tourism from those who know it best.

The Vista Restaurant and Terrace Café sit almost 1000ft above sea level. They provide views for miles across the valley, a great place to soak up the surroundings while enjoying a freshly made meal, accompanied by a local ale or gin.

New for 2022, willow sculptures by artist Caroline Gregson capture important moments of the history of the Heights of Abraham, paused in time. For the kids, walk down through the woodland and spot 12 new butterflies in the treetops. A brand-new exhibition will be installed in the Masson Pavilion later on this year.

Access to everything at the Heights is included in the cable car ticket, giving you entry to fascinating exhibitions, historic buildings, spectacular viewpoints and more. The Heights is open from the 12th of February.

Jump on board and journey back in time!


Dudley Canal Trust staff have been busy adding new offers for 2022 to ensure there is so much more to see and do.

Meet the horse power behind your canal trip


Horse Drawn Boat trips have been operating from Llangollen Wharf since 1884 making it one of the major attractions in North Wales.
